

A Note from Executive Director Angie

Happy fall, Racinians!

The last few months, the Racine Public Library has kept up the momentum of its reopening earlier this year. We're continuing to host activities in in-person formats, including Maker Mondays, technology help classes, storytimes and many of our adult programs. At the same time, we're continuing to provide digital resources and programs for patrons to access remotely. Our re-emergence back into physical spaces is a great chance to build a new balance of services that satisfy those ready to connect in-person while supporting



those who need to remain at home.

This is an exciting opportunity for a level of accessibility previously unexplored, and we'll continue to thoughtfully explore and assess these efforts as they develop.

On the same theme of re-imagining, we're continuing to expand services in ways that shift the focus of the library from collecting books to serving people. We've **added a full-time social worker to our staff, expanded our hours on Friday and Saturday mornings**, and been building technologically driven partnerships with Racine Unified School District and local schools. Our tech team has visited schools every week to offer on-site technology outreaches and STEAM training as well as virtual class connections. My goal is to bring competence and confidence with technology and coding to every member of our community, and starting with our youth is a great way to make that shift.

Reorganization of our physical spaces is another big focus as we emphasize accessibility and human services. We've re-opened a section of the play area in the youth services space and re-introduced seating throughout the building. Our multisensory space is also close to its grand opening, slated for January of 2022. Meanwhile, our second floor is preparing for a total renovation into a new community resource space. We're eagerly working towards this much-needed upgrade, which will include a new entry to the library via Lake Avenue, an expanded Innovation Lab with more space and more technology, a dedicated Teen Space, a Business Center, additional study rooms, an upgraded Local History Room and much more. **If you're interested in supporting these efforts, we're always accepting donations.**

I want to offer my sincerest thanks to all those who visit the library building, stop into the Bookmobile or chat with us through our call center. It's been a joy to help you explore your passions and interests, and we always eagerly await our next chance to help you discover something new.


