EARTH DAY CLEAN UP


Celebrate Earth Day by beautifying the Racine Public Library with a new native plant garden and a clean-up of the library grounds and lakeshore.

There are still a few days left for you to snag some extra deals by showing your library card at participating businesses. National Library week runs through Sunday, April 10.



Celebrating 125 Years in Racine



In 1950, the Racine Public Library teamed up with the Milwaukee Public Library to provide new resources to both libraries' patrons.

Among the resources were two teletype machines, which that allowed users to send and receive text-based messages. Senders would type their message on a keyboard, and the message would print onto paper at the recipient's machine. This was the first teletype service available in Wisconsin.







New Book Display: True Crime
