There's also a lot of tools in the Beyond Books Collection — some familiar, like pliers and binoculars, plus some obscure ones that are tons of fun to try. 

We're blowing up our big screen, bringing out the projector and firing up the popcorn machine for a riveting Summer Scares Fright Night!


