Library Highlights: New Techmobile Next Week, Labor Day Closing




After more than a year of planning, fundraising, shipping delays and a little bit of everything in between, the Racine Public Library is excited to announce that the new Techmobile will be here next week!

Throughout the evening, we will sell library merchandise, hot dogs and walking tacos. Be sure to also shop from the craft and baked good vendors around the circle. See you there!








Banned Books Month

New Homepage for Friends of the Library


