

Coming out as LGBTQ+ still matters. Those who know an openly LGBTQ+


person are more likely to support equality under the law. Beyond that, our stories can be powerful to each other. Will you share yours with us?



Hispanic Heritage Month

The observation of Hispanic Heritage Week started in 1968 under President Lyndon Johnson. In 1988, President Ronald Reagan expanded it to a 30-day period from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15. Hispaninc heritage Month was enacted into law on Aug. 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The date of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on Sept. 16 and Sept. 18, respectively. Also, Día de la Raza, which is Oct. 12, falls within this 30 day period.








