

Are You Election Ready?

Voting by mail this year?



Any Wisconsin voter can vote by mail using an absentee ballot.

Step 3: Fill Out Your Ballot

First, make sure you have another person present to be your witness. Your witness can be any adult US citizen, as long as they're not a candidate in the election.

Next, carefully fill out your ballot. If you make a mistake here or want to change your mind on your vote, you can contact your municipal clerk's office for help.

Once you're done, put your ballot

There's no requirement for requesting one, but there is a deadline.

Step 1: Request Your Absentee Ballot

Make sure to request your absentee ballot as early as possible. Starting early makes sure your election workers can get your ballot to your mailbox with plenty of time for you to vote.

Request Your Ballot

Step 2: Track Your Request

Once you submit your request for a ballot, it's time to wait for it to arrive. While you wait, you can track your request to see where your ballot is at in the process.

Track Your Ballot

in the return envelope it came with. Then seal and sign the envelope, and have your witness add their address and signature.

Find Your Clerk

Step 4: Return Your Ballot

Place the sealed and signed envelope back in the mail. No postage is needed. You can track the status of your ballot again at this stage.

If it's less than seven days until the election, you may want to drop your ballot off in person to make sure it arrives on time.

Once you mail your ballot, you cannot vote in person for this election.






