

2nd Floor Renovation








Ways to Read: Libby, Comics & Graphic Novels

New Filters for Libby Searches

In a previous update, Libby introduced a new filtering system on the Shelf and Timeline to streamline how readers sort and filter loans, holds, tags and reading activity. With Libby's



most recent update, the new filtering system is now available when browsing and searching our catalog. It replaces the previous Preferences and Refine options and appears on Libby's Racine Public Library home screen, the search screen, lists, search results and catalog guides.

- To use the new filtering system, just tap the new icon to sort and filter titles from Libby's Racine Public Library home screen, the search screen, lists, catalog guides or search results.
 - You can now find the subject filters in the filtering list.
 - Other sort and filter options include format, audience, language, availability, popularity and date added to the collection.
- You can now pin your favorite sort and filter options.
 - Once you pins a sort or filter, it is automatically applied to all lists, catalog guides and search results. For example, parents can pin the "Juvenile" or "Young Adult" audience filters for young readers, or users can pin the "available now" filter to always see content that is immediately ready to borrow.
 - Preferences you previously set have been automatically converted into pinned sorts and filters.
 - Pinned sorts and filters appear on the home screen for easy access.



Find your Love for Comics and Graphic Novels

I grew up on "Archie and Friends" and "Calvin and Hobbes," but when high school and college came along, I forgot that graphic novels existed. It wasn't until I started working at the Racine Public Library and was encouraged by a coworker to pick up





the series "Locke and Key" by Joe Hill that I fell back in love. There was an intensity and awe to these novels, and I was immediately graphic novels' biggest fan.

I believe that graphic novels are for everyone. Now that I've become the curator for young adult and adult graphic novels in my continued work at the Racine Public Library, I have developed a passion for finding the right graphic novel for people.

I was excited when in 2021, the Racine Public Library was able to purchase a subscription to Comics Plus. This resource is fantastic — it lets you check out graphic novels for all ages, with no limits to check-out or reading time. While Comics Plus does not have the big name superhero comics of DC Comics or Marvel, it still has great publishers like Dark Horse, Boom! Studio, Yen Press, Manga Classics, and its newest publisher, Europe Comics. All you need to access these great graphic novels from your own devices is your Racine Public Library card.

If you need a recommendation to get started, my current favorites are the "Something is Killing the Children" series by James Tynion IV or "The Way of the House Husband" series by Kousuke Oono for young adults and adults, and either "Wallace the Brave" by Will Henry or "Crabgrass" by Tauhid Bondia for children and middle schoolers.
